Congratulations to Shelly & Sands, Inc.!

Shelly & Sands Inc. and the Ohio Department of Transportation – District 5 were named the winner of the national Sheldon G. Hayes Award for Shelly & Sands, Inc.'s work on I-77 in Guernsey County. The Sheldon G. Hayes Award winner is determined through a two-

year process. Highway pavement projects using more than 50,000 tons of asphalt are eligible for consideration. Initially, they must win a Quality in Construction (QIC) Award, and the year after a project wins a QIC Award, it may be considered for the Sheldon G. Hayes Award.


A one-mile test section of Void Reducing Asphalt Membrane (VRAM), new bridge deck construction that impacted the paving schedule, and the necessity to begin paving in the middle of the project due to bridge work being performed at the same time were some of the challenges that Shelly & Sands needed to overcome on their Sheldon G. Hayes winning project, I-77 in Guernsey County.

"A thermal camera was specified for this project," said Quality Director Ed Morrison. "The MOBA thermal scanner was utilized to monitor pavement temperature segregation from side to side across the mat." Per the project's specification, all data was shared with Ohio Department of Transportation.





Port Authority Ready For National Road Business Park Development

The planned groundbreaking for Muskingum County's fourth Business Park will be taking place this spring. The first phase of the development will be the creation of an access road, connecting East Pike (US 40) to the Park. Construction of 0.6 mile access road is planned to begin this spring, with completion projected for late fall 2020.



This illustration shows one possible layout for the Business Park. The main access road will end in a 5,500' diameter cul de sac near the large 111 acre southern portion of the site. Site Work Progressing for New AMG Vanadium Facility

Progress is continuing in the Eastpointe Business Park on the site where the new AMG Vanadium facility will make its home. Over 125,000 cubic yards of dirt have been moved

to create space for the pad for the new building and work has begun on a dedicated substation.

AMG Vanadium announced their \$300M investment in Muskingum County in June 2019, and the first phase of the new facility is planned to be operational in late 2020. Upon completion, 100+ new full-time jobs will be added to our community.
