#### **May Application Period is Open**



Ohio Lt. Governor Jon Husted announced the results of the March round of TechCred:

- 391 employers were approved for funding:
- 4,656 Ohioans earned techfocused credentials; and,
- Manufacturing was the industry with the most applications.

TechCred helps businesses address their workforce needs by:

- 1. Upskilling current and prospective employees.
- 2. Businesses of all sizes, from any industry, are eligible for up to \$30,000 per round and up to \$180,000 per year.
- 3. Top industries from this round include Manufacturing and Professional, Scientific and Technical Services.

Keeping with locally sourced products, an open kitchen will feature a standard menu as well as a rotating menu to showcase seasonal items.


The 5,000 sq. ft. of mixed use space on the



Road At Eastpointe Business Park Renamed in Honor of Local Businessman - Alan A. Baker


In 2012, Halliburton Energy Services was looking for a site for its new Northeast American headquarters.

The Halliburton CEO in 2012, Mr. Alan



Baker, had grown up in Duncan Falls, Muskingum County and was instrumental in the final decision to locate in the Eastpointe Business Park. His initiative brought hundreds of well paying jobs to his former hometown and established the world's second largest oilfield service company as one of Muskingum County's largest employers.

In recognition of the enormous contribution Mr. Baker made to the landscape of the Eastpointe Business Park and the Muskingum County community, the road located parallel to the Halliburton Energy Services site, between Jim Granger Drive and Bateman Road, has been renamed "Alan Baker Drive".



Alan A. Baker earned his Bachelor of Science degree in petroleum engineering from Marietta College, graduating in 1954. Following graduation, Baker joined Halliburton Services, a former division of Halliburton Company in Zanesville, OH, and held a series of engineering and managerial assignments across the United States before being named Vice President of Domestic Operations in 1977..

In 1981, he was transferred to Singapore as Senior Vice President for the Far East region. Mr. Baker continued to work his way through the leadership ranks, finally being named Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of Halliburton Energy Services Group in 1989 until his retirement in 1995.
